GUEST SPEAKERS

Dr. Toscani - Go bowling! Stelton Lanes at 8 PM. For those studying ID, just match the bug to the drug! Those of you who are interested in industry, it is not necessarily for everyone with a pharmacy degree. But if you are interested in exploring it, do so! It may open up a whole lot of opportunity for you. Thirty years ago, there was not really a path for PharmD's in the pharmaceutical industry. All of those either went to work in teaching, doing a residency. I had no idea what the pharmacy industry was all about - I visited Eli Lilly in Indiana, and it was nice, but I didn't know about a career. During my fellowship, I got to do research with all different antibiotics. Miles, now Bayer, asked me to come on board for their research. I was opportunistic - why not? Then I had a 30 year career in working in the industry with antibiotics such as cipro, piperacillin, all the cephalosporins, the tetracyclines. I got to become a managing director. I've held every pharmacy job I could have. I was a community pharmacist, a hospital pharmacist, and then went into academia. I just haven't worked for the federal government. So for my career, industry was wonderful. Subsequently, the industry has changed 1000 percent. It's common to see thousands of pharmacists working in the pharmaceutical industry. If you are interested in a fellowship.... we had 450 applicants looking for 61 or 62 positions. The good news is, Rutgers does very well. Rutgers puts 20-25% of its students into those positions. The rest come from schools all over the US. It is very competitive, it is 16 different pharmaceutical companies predominantly here on the east coast. I am visiting genentech on the West coast tomorrow. But years ago, there was no such thing as a PharmD in a pharmaceutical company. But now it is commonplace. They have become presidents, vice presidents, graduates of our fellowship program have become senior vice presidents of pharma companies.

Do very well in school first. If you can work on scholarly activities such as posters, while you're in school, with a faculty member, it is very popular. If you took any leadership courses or work in student government, that is an important ingredient. If you get a chance to rotate in a pharmaceutical company or have an internship, that's very good. Have 3 or 4 of those ingredients on your CV.

If any of you have any interest in the pharma industry, schedule an appointment with my assistant, Janet Lupo.

The fellowship program is like the NY Yankees of the baseball world. We have 100 fellows next year. The next closest program might have 10. Last year, two of our graduates ended up working outside of the United States, in China and Switzerland.

75% of fellows end up at the company they do a fellowship with. Novartis is almost 100% retention. It may not be the same department, but somewhere in that company, you're in there.

Doing a rotation will get you a taste, taking a class will give you a taste. Talking to the fellows will give you a taste. But doing some time inside a pharma company either as an intern or as a student on rotation will be good. Then you can see what the department looks like and if the culture is what you want.

You still have a license to practice. Nobody is taking that away from you. The nice thing about a pharmacy degree, and I've been blessed with having the flexibility; every job I had never existed before. You have a lot of choices, and you can get in and out of the workforce as you please. You have a more flexible degree than anyone I'm aware of.

We have two fellows who have combined MBA/PharmD, and one of them had a JD/PharmD. There is a PharmD/PhD fellowship at Catalent with formulation. If you have additional degrees or clinical experience, that's helpful too. Not required. There are a lot of graduates who come right out of school into the fellowship program.
